Voting independently with a disability is possible

If you are an American citizen that is 18 years of age or older and are registered to vote, it is your right to exercise that aspect of American citizenship. Even if you think that do not possess the fine motor skills or dexterity that you may believe are required in order to vote, think again. Gone are the days where you need a polling assistant to help you fill out your ballot, thanks to the new accessible machines! Simply ask a poll worker to use the jelly buttons, and a worker that has been trained about the adaptive equipment will set them up to best suit your needs. There are now laws that have been put into place to ensure that all polling places are accessible for everyone. Be sure to do some research about accessibility options at polling places before deciding not to go vote because you are under the misconception that you will not be able to.

Also, before voting, educate yourself on the positions of each presidential candidate in regards to disabilities. ACHIEVING A BETTER LIFE EXPERIENCE

As of April 29, 2016, the South Carolina Achieving a Better Life Experience (ABLE) legislation has been in effect. Now, they are working with the Office of State Treasurer Curtis M. Loftis, Jr. to conduct research and make tax-advantaged ABLE savings accounts available in South Carolina. These accounts will help individuals with disabilities and their families and friends save for future expenses that may arise, without jeopardizing existing government benefits. They are researching these programs that have been launched in other states in order to provide the best options to our state.
